### Safe School Initiatives

As per COVID-19 procedures parents are reminded to drop off their children at the playground entry/exit doors between 8:00-8:15 a.m. at the beginning of the school day and to meet their child(ren) at a prearranged location at the front of the school or at the appropriate exit doors at the 2:35 p.m. bell to support the Safe School initiatives.

Parents/guardians are required to wear masks while on school property. Please do not enter the building without an appointment or enter the yard to drop-off or pick up your child.

We thank you for your support of these initiatives to further ensure the safety of your child(ren).

### Mask Protocol

All students in Grades 4-8 are required to wear non-medical face masks indoors in school, including hallways, during classes and transported in a school vehicle. Students in K – Grade 3 are strongly encouraged to wear masks.

### Masks should be:

- Large enough to completely cover the nose and mouth without gaping
- Fit securely with ties or ear loops
- Made of at least 2 layers of tightly woven material (cotton/linen)
- Changed if wet, damaged, or soiled
- Cleaned with soap and water

While being worn, masks should not be touched, moved around or adjusted often. Hands should be sanitized before putting on a mask and after taking it off.

# Safe Welcome Program Visitors and Volunteers

### By appointment only

The Safe Welcome Program is in effect at JSPS. Our school has front door security systems and locked doors, which include a camera and intercom, connected with the school offices. Parents and visitors need to arrange meetings in advance and complete the COVID-19 prescreening tool, prior to coming to the school. Parents/guardian and visitors are required to buzz the office and await a response prior to entering on the day and time of the pre-arranged appointment. Please wait to be "buzzed in" by office staff, who will release the door lock from inside. All other outside doors to the school will remain locked, as they have been in the past. We do understand that this procedure may cause some inconvenience; however, the safety of James Strath students is our highest priority. Volunteer assistance is not taking place in the school at this time.



# Allergen Aware School

As we begin a new school year we would like to inform you that James Strath is an allergen aware school. There are students and staff in attendance who suffer from severe and life threatening allergies to certain foods, such as peanut and nut products. Exposure to the smallest quantities can cause severe life threatening reactions.

We would appreciate the co-operation of the entire school community by NOT sending any lunches or snacks that contain nuts, nut oils or derivatives (e.g. peanut butter, peanuts, or peanut oil) which could potentially harm someone.

Furthermore, bringing cologne and perfume to school is *not permitted*. A number of individuals are highly sensitive to scents which can result in severe headaches and asthma attacks. Aerosol deodorant is discouraged as students often spray it at their locker, creating a dangerous situation in our hallways.

Thank you for your attention to these important matters.







### Student Verification Forms

KPRDSB will be sending Student Verification Forms via a student portal. An email will be sent with instructions to access the form and will require the student's OEN (Ontario Education Number) which can be found on the report card. Please update/complete all pages of the Verification Form as it is used to update our student data base. It is very important that we have accurate information, especially parent contact numbers for emergencies and current email addresses.

### **Bus Safety**

Please review the following rules for students riding the school bus, as this will help ensure student safety.

### Students are required to:

- be at the bus stop at least 5 minutes before the pickup time
- listen to the driver when getting on or off the bus, especially when a road must be crossed
- go directly to their seat and stay seated until they are let off the bus
- follow all instructions from the bus driver especially where they put their belongings
- not eat or drink, fight, swear or engage in other types of poor behavior
- not open or close windows unless the driver permits
- keep all belongings inside the bus
- keep arms, hands, heads etc. inside the bus
- not damage the bus seats (students will be held responsible)
- respect private property

Every effort must be made to maintain a high standard of discipline and safety in the operation of the school buses. On the **FIRST** occasion of improper behavior, the Principal will speak to the student. On the **SECOND** occasion, a letter or phone call will be made to the parents.

### Violence Threat Risk Assessment

The KPR Board is committed to providing safe learning environments for all. When students behave inappropriately, principals use progressive discipline to change behaviour. When student behaviours pose a potential threat to safety or serious harm, KPR's Violence Threat Risk Assessment (VTRA) protocol helps principals take immediate steps to protect student well-being. While such incidents are rare, the VTRA outlines how we work with local police, mental health providers and community agencies to keep students safe.

Also, thank you for not parking in our accessible parking spots unless you have proper identification/visible permit.

# Plans of Care and Medication at School

If your child has a life-threatening allergy, or serious medical condition, please notify the office immediately. We need to know this information so that we can create a Plan of Care for your child. The forms for Plan of Care can be found on the school website. To access the form, please download it directly to your computer and open from the folder you've saved the form to. If you have any further questions, please contact Ms. Johnston in the office.

Please be advised that for safety reasons, no child should bring any form of medication to school without prior approval from the office. The school will store necessary medication if an Administration of Medication Form has been filled out and **signed by the doctor**. Forms are available in the office.



## James Strath Nutrition Program

The Student Nutrition Program at James Strath supports the healthy development of children and helps children attend school ready to learn. Research shows many benefits including improved academic performance, higher rates of school attendance, fewer classroom disruptions, and improved student behaviour.

Students may come to school hungry for a number of reasons such as hurried morning routines, long bus rides to school, not feeling hungry before leaving for school, insufficient food in the home, or early morning practices and rehearsals.

This is a universal program, free for all students. Each day, students have access to fresh produce, whole grains and dairy products. The program looks different this year as measures have been taken to ensure student safety. Snacks are available at the office.

### MORNING CHECKLIST



ool morning routines might look a little different this year, so we have put together a checklist to help!

In addition to getting dressed, eating breakfast, brushing hair and teeth, families also need to think about the following items:



#### Daily COVID self-assessment

o Review the self-screening checklist each day with your children before sending them to school. If they answer 'yes' to any of the questions, keep your child home and contact your health care provider or a COVID Assessment Centre for direction. The Ontario government also has an online screening tool for schools: https://covid-19.ontario.ca/school-screening/



- o Send students with at least two masks per day in case one gets dirty.
- o Remind children about how to wear and handle masks properly.
- o Send a paper bag for storing masks in back packs.



#### Wash or sanitize hands

- o Before and after bus transportation, and
- o Upon arrival at school.
- o Students will be reminded to wash or sanitize hands frequently during the school day.
